MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

It is my privilege and pleasure to greet you and wish you a fruitful 1991 in heterocyclic chemistry! The roots of heterocyclic chemistry continue to be in evidence in a multitude of current activities, e.g. in synthetic work related to HIV substances; like vintage wines, heterocycles offer surprises in modern settings, e.g. molecular recognition; the chameleon character of heterocyclic compounds is ever evident, e.g. asymmetric synthesis, and will undoubtedly be a major driving force in this field in this decade.

In the continuation of my presidency, I wish to reaffirm my dedication towards achieving and hopefully enhancing the goals of our Society which, stated in different terms, is to fulfill the collective interest of you, the membership of the ISHC. It is also collectively, together with equally dedicated efforts of Executive/Advisory Committee Members, PHC Editors, and Fund Raisers whose names are given below, that we are able to advance the aims of our Society.

## 2. The 13th ICHC, Corvallis, Oregon, August 11-16, 1991

It is not too early to begin plans to attend the 13th ICHC, to submit your most recent work either as an oral or poster presentation, and to encourage your colleagues to do likewise! The 13th ICHC promises to be the meeting of 1991! I look forward to renewing acquaintances and meeting new faces in Corvallis in August.

### 3. Progress in Heterocyclic Chemistry (PHC)

Launched at the 12th ICHC in Jerusalem in 1989, the PHC series is rapidly establishing itself as an indispensable bench and office reference work in heterocyclic chemistry. The Society is most grateful to the Editors, Hans Suschitzky and Eric Scriven, the expert contributors of reviews and accounts, and the distinguished Editorial Board who have nurtured and guided the PHC venture which has been so enthusiastically received by the chemical community. Volumes 1 and 2 are undoubtedly on a shelf close to your desk or lab bench; Volume 3 of PHC is currently in preparation and will evidently be ready for the 13th ICHC. # 4. Special Meeting of the Executive/Advisory Committee, Twente University, Enschede, The Netherlands, July 6, 1990

Members of the Executive/Advisory Committees (Bergman, Neunhoeffer, Snieckus, and van der Plas) held a most productive one-day meeting which had an agenda of no less than twelve items ranging from Proposed Constitutional and Bylaw Revisions to a Status Report on the 14th ICHC. According to our Constitution, a number of these issues must be brought before the Membership at large for a vote at the General Meeting of the Society in Corvallis.

### 5. Cooperation with Other Heterocyclic Societies

Through the devoted efforts of Hamish McNab, Secretary, information on the ISHC and PHC reached about 1000 members of the Royal Society of Chemistry (RSC) Heterocyclic Group. Through Dr. McNab and Dr. O. Meth-Cohn, Chairman, we now have a standing arrangement to incorporate information on our forthcoming ICHCs, PHCs, and related matters of the Society in the mailings of all RSC members and at meetings (e.g. the famous Lakehead Symposia) of this very active group of heterocyclic chemists.

Coincidentally, with the help of the always attentive Hans Suschitzky, we have been informed about the newly formed Heterocyclic Group of the Austrian Chemical Society whose founder, Prof. Dr. Friz Sauter celebrated his 60th birthday at the Inaugural Heterocyclic Symposium in Vienna on May 23, 1990. Here another link among heterocyclic chemists was established and will, with the obvious good will and enthusiasm of both sides, bring cooperation and continue long into the future for the benefit of our discipline.

May I wish all of you successful heterochemical activities and happiness and peace in your daily lives. I look forward to greeting all of you in Corvallis next August!
