

16th ICHC in Bozeman in Review

The major ISHC event of 1997 was the 16th ISHC Congress held in Bozeman, Montana during the week of August 10-15 and was superbly organized by Tom Livinghouse (Montana State University) and his colleagues. Over 950 delegates assembled to hear what was arguably one of the best program of speakers yet assembled for these meetings. •ISHC Senior Award Winner in Heterocyclic Chemistry for 1997, Albert I. Meyers

The vital role that heterocyclic chemistry plays in contemporary organic chemical synthesis owes much of its origins to the outstanding research contributions of the Meyers group. Of particular note is his seminal work of the use and development of optically active heterocycles as templates in asymmetric syntheses. Professor Meyers has been recognized widely for his outstanding contributions to our field, including his election to the U. S. National Academy of Sciences in 1994. Moreover, Al has trained an extremely large group of graduate and postdoctoral co-workers who have assumed important positions in both academic and pharmaceutical research worldwide. The ISHC is very proud to honor him as the 1997 ISHC award winner.

•ISHC Junior Katritzky Award Winner in Heterocyclic Chemistry for 1997, Dale L. Boger

Dale L. Boger was recognized for his work in organic synthesis, heterocyclic chemistry, natural products total synthesis and biological evaluation, synthetic methodology development, medicinal and bioorganic chemistry and has made seminal contributions to the understanding of DNA-agent interactions of naturally occurring antitumor-antibiotics. Most notable is his development and application of the hetero Diels-Alder reaction to the syntheses of complex natural products, and his development and applications of the cycloaddition reactions of cyclopropenone ketals. Applications of this may be found in his total syntheses of natural products including bleomycin A2, CC-1065, streptonigrin, lavendamycin, colchicine, prodigiosin, trikentrin A, duocarmycin SA, duocarmycin A, deoxybouvardin and bouvardin, sandramycin, isochrysohermidin, and grandirubrine. Dale is the first award winner of this newly created prize for scientists under the age of 45 years and in honor of Alan Katritzky.

ChemKey Search Computer Database

Receive a substantial (\$75) discount on the *ChemKey Search Database*. This computer database devotes particular attention to such areas of interest as heterocycles, synthetic methods, organometallic chemistry, asymmetric synthesis, chirality, stereochemistry, and much more. It contains 55,000 references and is updated annually, adding about 10% to its size over a one-year period. References since 1960 are derived from all the significant journals, letters, papers, and other published material that are routinely and traditionally used by heterocyclic chemists. The keywords used for each article are well chosen and reflect the way a heterocyclic chemist would classify a particular reaction or topic. Now you can obtain a demo version of *Chemkey Search Database* for either a Mac of PC by downloading it off the Internet (http://euch6f.chem.emory.edu/).
