Of course, we thank Gordon for his continued dedication to PHC.

The 28th ISHC Congress has been postponed to 2022

As you are all hopefully already aware, the 28th ISHC Congress, originally planned for late summer 2021 in Portland, Oregon, USA, has been postponed to late summer 2022 because of the uncertainty surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic. We still anticipate holding the event in Portland; however, more work needs to be done, and updates will be forthcoming.

ISHC Awards Postponed

As the ISHC Awards (E. C. Taylor Senior Award, A. R. Katritzky Junior Award, and ISHC Industrial Award) are tied to award lectures at the (normally) biennial congress, the nomination and selection processes will be delayed by a year. Information about the nomination process will be

released near the end of 2021 for the 2022 set of awards; the award lectures will then be held at the 28th Congress.

Obituaries

During 2020 we were sad to lose several major figures in heterocyclic chemistry, who had been important contributors to the ISHC:

Sir John Cadogan, Plenary Lecturer at the 6th Congress in Tehran in 1977, died in Swansea on 9th February at the age of 89.

Rolf Huisgen, Plenary Lecturer at the first congress in 1967 and ISHC Senior Award winner in 1987, died in Munich on 26th March at the age of 99.

Victor Snieckus, ISHC Senior Awardee in 2001, Plenary Lecturer in 1999 and 1983, and Chair of the 1985 Waterloo Congress, died in Kingston, Ontario on 18th December at the age of 83.

James D. White, Chair of the 1991 Corvallis Congress, died in Albany, Oregon on 10th February at the age of 84.

Robert M. Williams, Plenary Lecturer in 2009 and Chair of the 2003 Fort Collins Congress, died in Fort Collins on 13th May at the age of 67.
