ChemKey Search Computer Database

Receive a substantial (\$75) discount on the ChemKey Search Database. This computer database devotes particular attention to such areas of interest as heterocycles, synthetic methods, organometallic chemistry, asymmetric synthesis, chirality, stereochemistry, and much more. It contains 40,000 references and is updated annually, adding about 10% to its size over a onevear period. References since 1960 are derived from all the significant journals, letters, papers, and other published material that are routinely and traditionally used by heterocyclic chemists. The keywords used for each article are well chosen and reflect the way a heterocyclic chemist would classify a particular reaction or topic.
